



Deborah Ghate, D. Phil, FAcSS Chief Executive

Profile

Deborah is an internationally acknowledged researcher, analyst and organisational leader specialising in implementation science and practice in child and family services. She has been Chief Executive of the independent non-profit Colebrooke Centre for Evidence and Implementation since 2011. The Colebrooke Centre is the UK's first centre dedicated to using the learning and tools from the globally emerging field of implementation (the science and practice of effective service delivery) to improve systems and services for children and families. Between 2008 and 2011 she was the founding Director and Chief Executive of the Centre for Effective Services in Ireland and Northern Ireland, funded by the Irish government and the Atlantic Philanthropies to promote and support evidence-informed approaches to children's policy and services. Between 1998 and 2007, Deborah was the director of the leading independent Policy Research Bureau in London, conducting and disseminating research and evaluation studies in policy and practice in child and family services. She has also held research posts at the Policy Studies Institute, the Institute of Education, University of London, and at the University of Oxford. Deborah teaches and lectures on implementation and improvement in human services and is the author of a large number of influential publications on services for children and families including books, reports, toolkits and journal articles. She currently serves on the Board of the Global Implementation Initiative (GII) and is Chair of the UK Implementation Network (UK-IN). She is currently a visiting fellow at the Centre for Child and Family Research, University of Loughborough, and was formerly visiting Professor at Royal Holloway University of London.
